Acrylic on canvas dot paintings, wearable and useable art painted items make up Rose's ever expanding range of works as she paints on as many surfaces as possible.

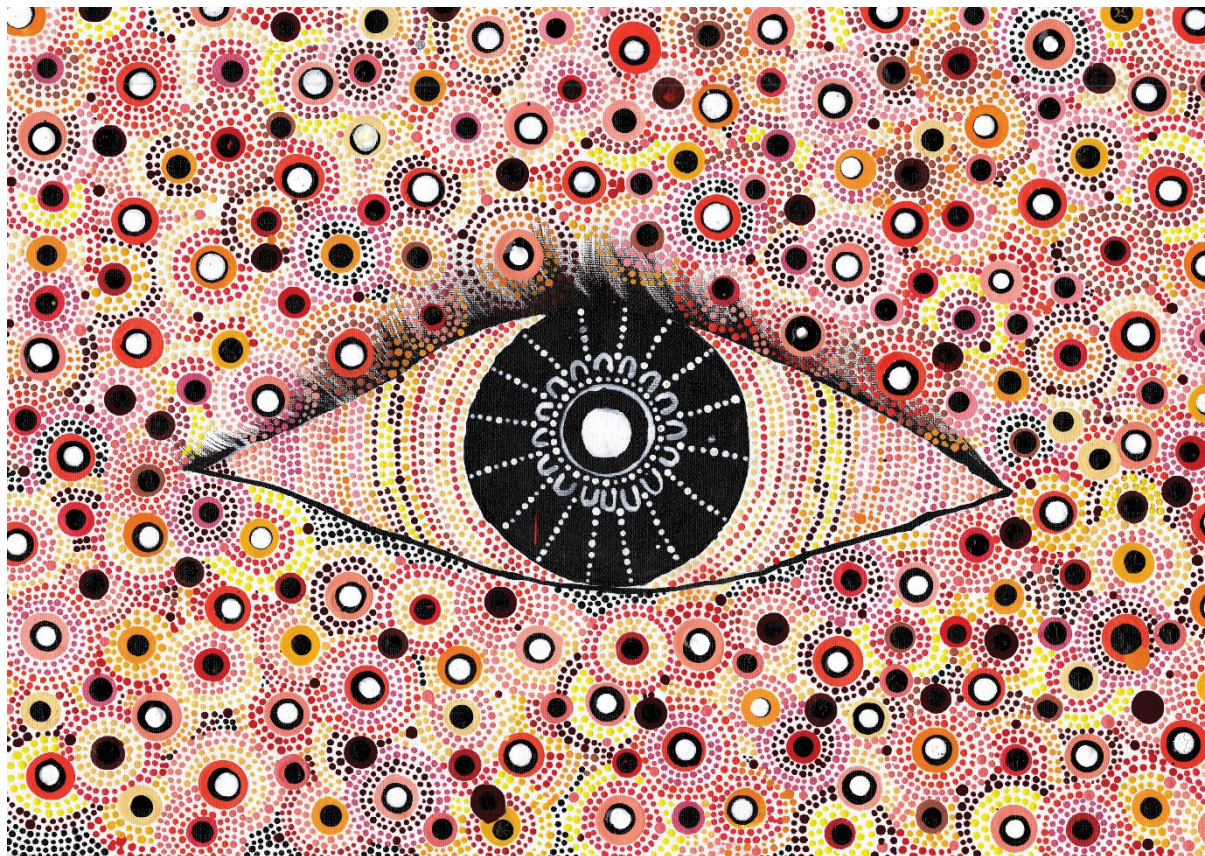
Rose approaches every day as an opportunity to learn and face new adventures. She is passionate about sharing her art and her life skills with the Community of Coolgardie.

Connected Community by Rose Mitchell



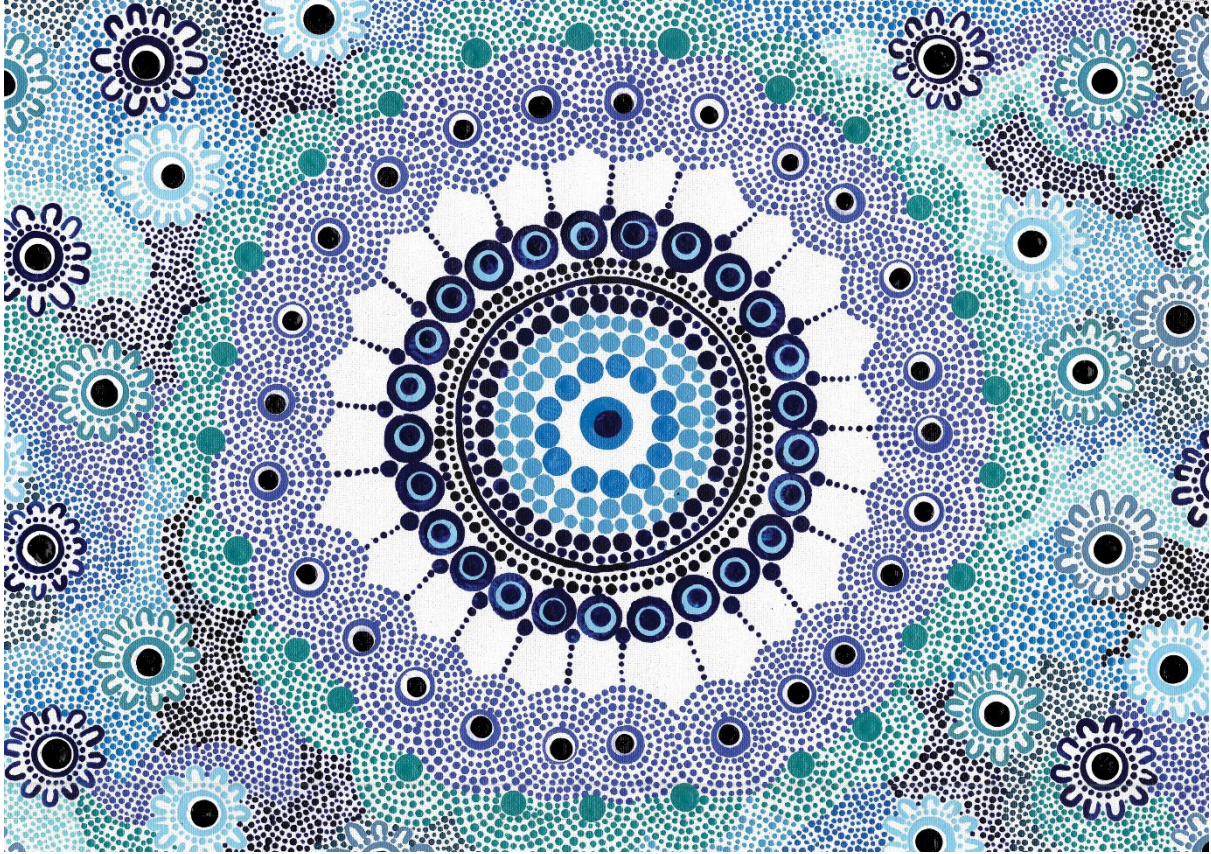
I believe our lives and communities are connected everywhere, be it one person or a Town.

Eyes on Community and Country by Rose Mitchell



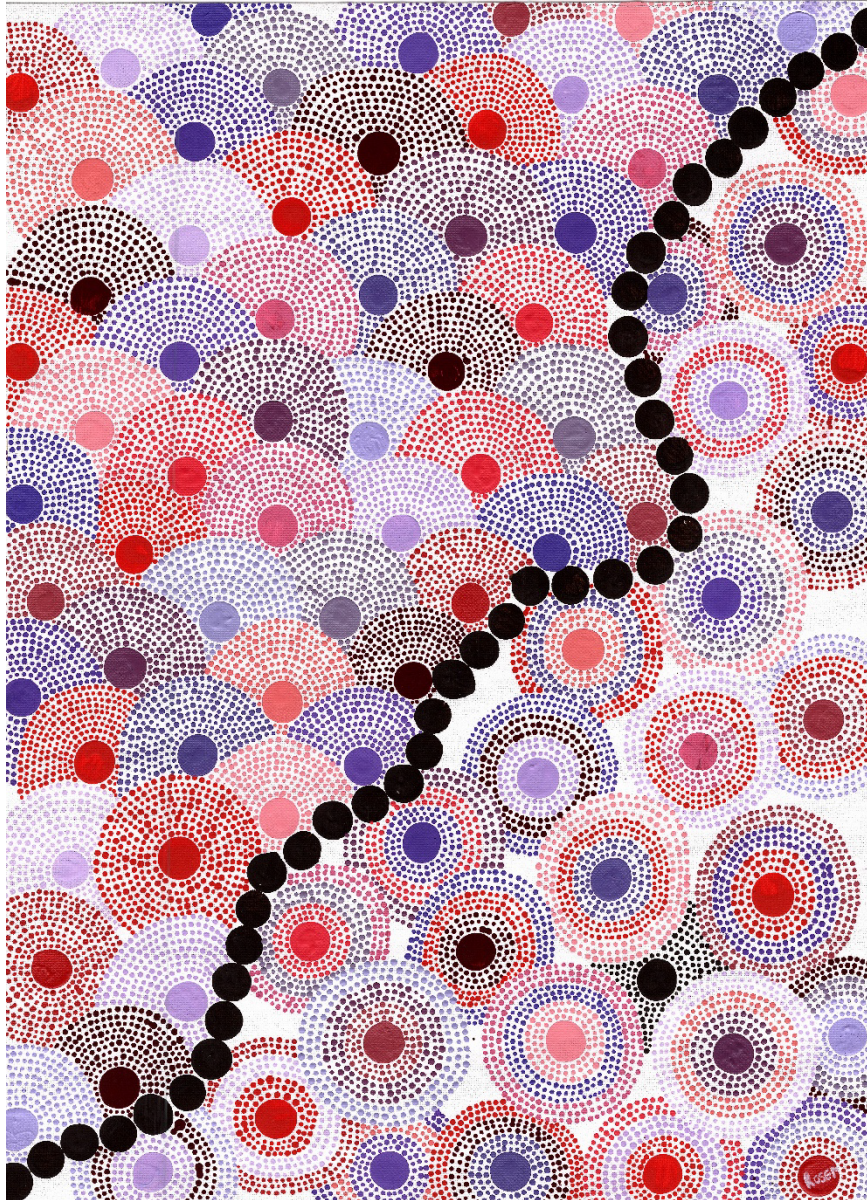
While I may not be Full Blood and very traditional as a First Nations person I have been taught to show respect to other groups and to take care of Country and the Community area in which I live.

Community United by Rose Mitchell



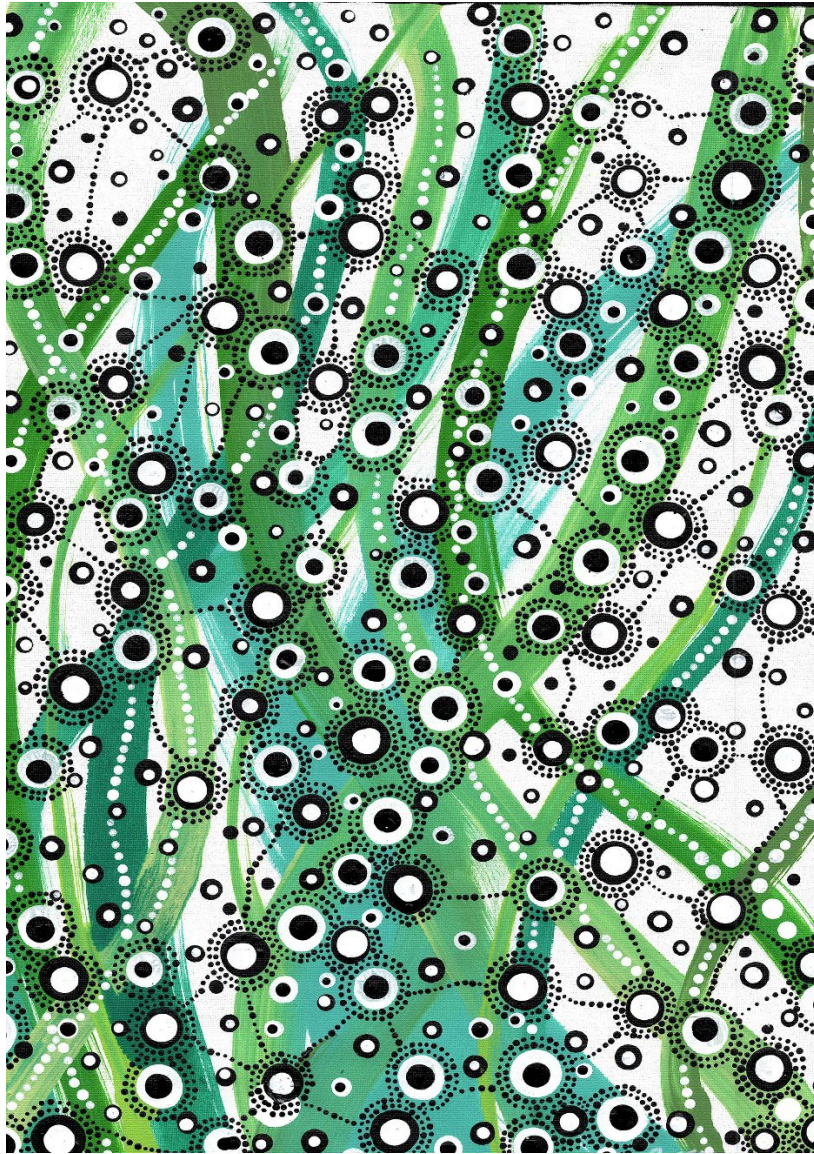
This painting is about many Communities coming together to meet and be united in a common cause. In many ways it could also be the unity of families through history.

Under the Sea by Rose Mitchell



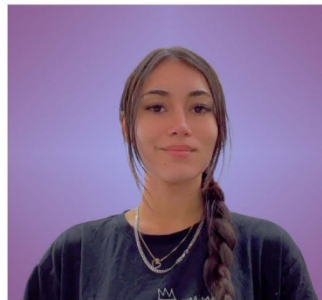
I once went snorkelling and remember the many colours under the water but how plain things look when taken out.

Kyeesha Taylor

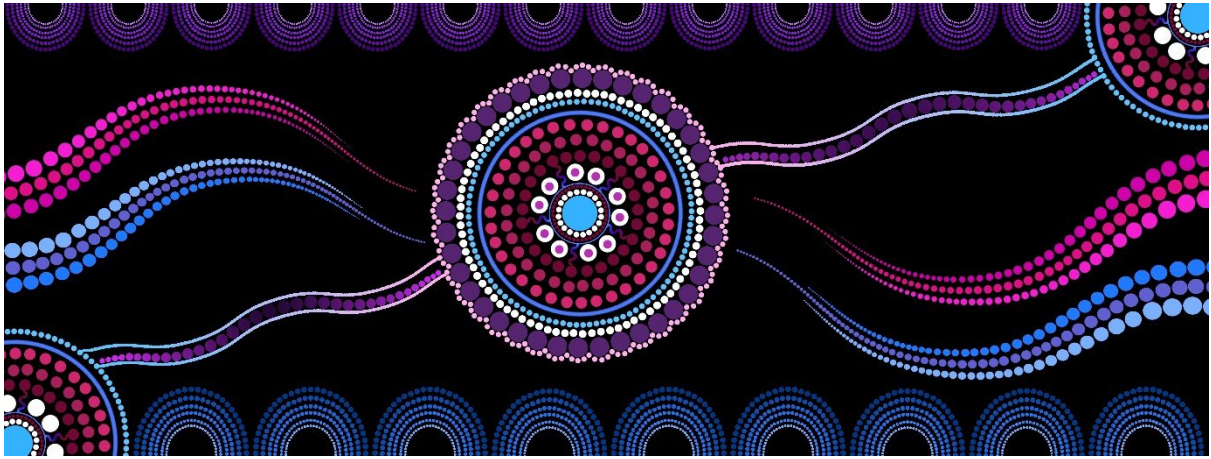

She started creating her artwork after moving to her job at Judumul Aboriginal Corporation in Coolgardie where she began exploring digital art through photoshop. Her job allows her to express creative freedom, where she gets to design, print and press her artworks onto all kinds of items, from fabrics to earrings and other objects.

With her art designs mostly being for fun, Kyeesha doesn't really plan them, her art gets inspired by small everyday life matters, and an assortment of things she sees on the internet. She combines these ideas together, until she gets a design she's satisfied with.

Neon Currents by Kyeesha Taylor



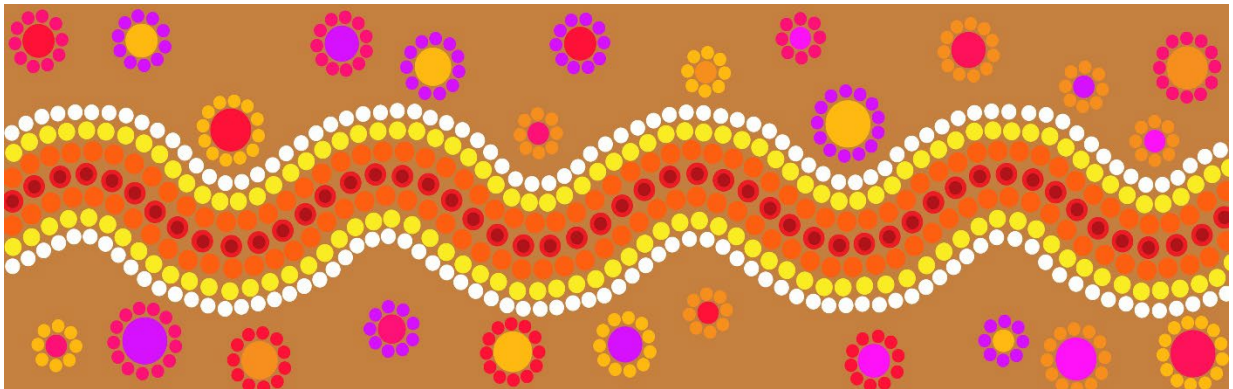
This artwork explores how we all have our own currents that we flow on, moving along separate path where we can cross with others before continuing on with our flow.

Rainbow Plains by Kyeesha Taylor



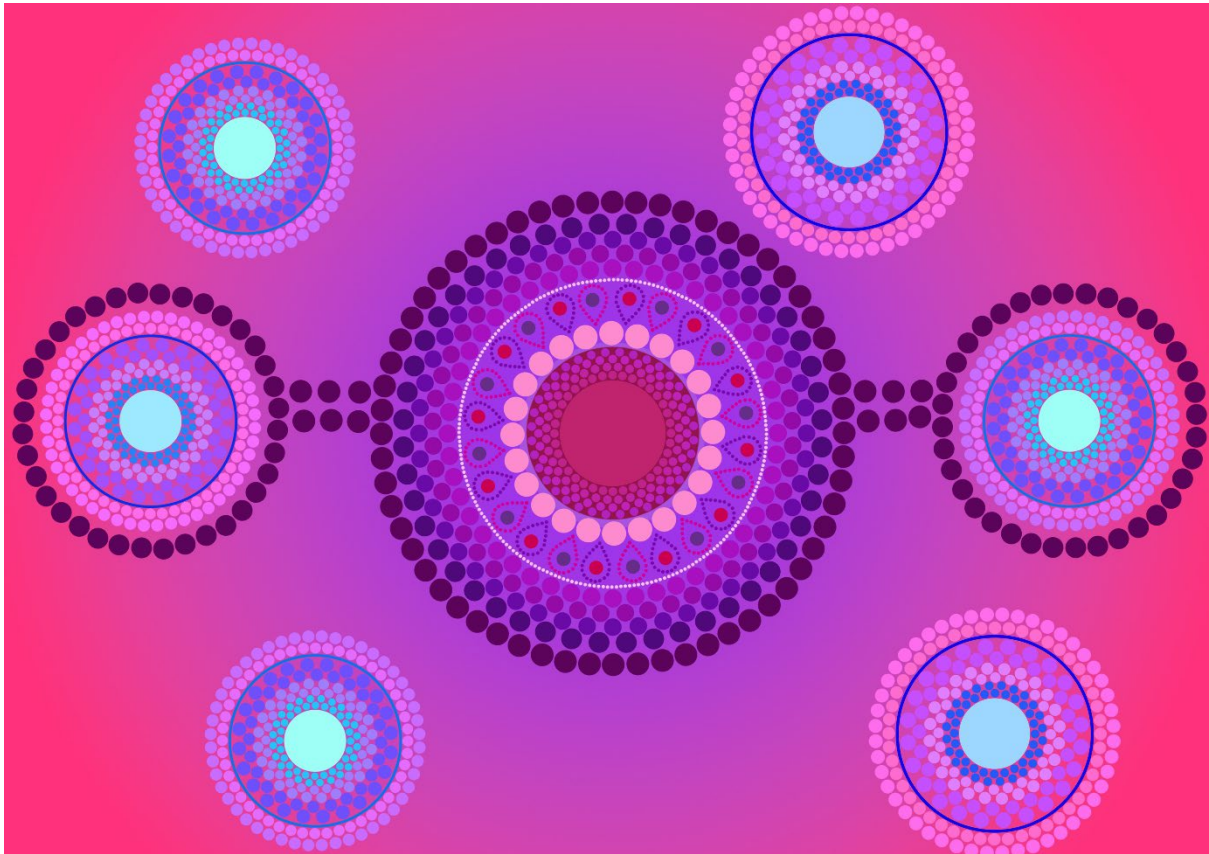
The various colours and shapes of the world can flow into one another to build the unique scenery found across the lands.

Drifting Together by Kyeesha Taylor



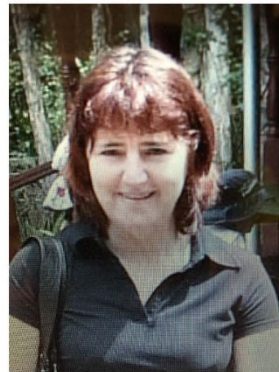
Drifting Together is about how we all tend to go down our own paths over time, but we're all still linked by the bonds that pull us all together.

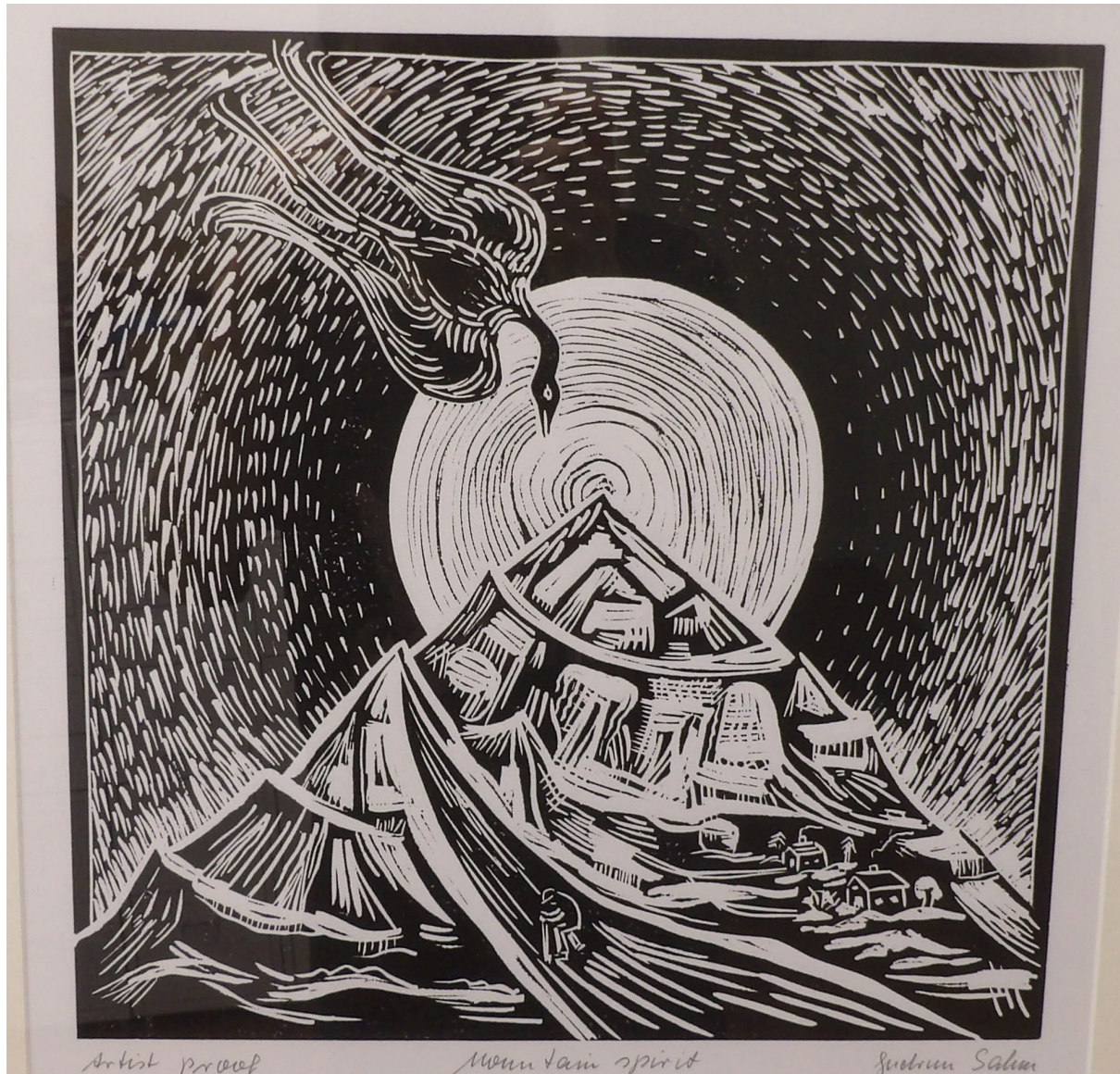

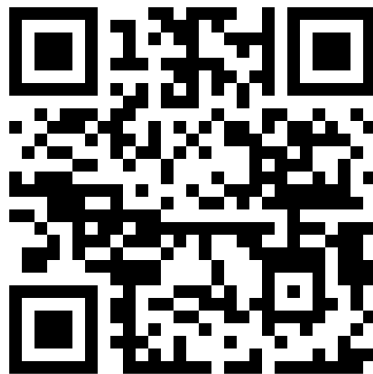
